Indri

Karen has been dating Hashim for a few months. Karen is considering having sex with Hashim but isn't sure what method of birth control to use. Karen and Hashim haven't talked about plans to prevent pregnancy or STBBI transmission.

- Their friend(s)
- A parent, teacher or other trusted adult
- A healthcare provider

Zev & Lian

Read the scenario together. Plan a skit to present to your classmates that shows a realistic and healthy response to this situation.

Zev and Lian have been dating for six months and have talked about having sex. Lian is on the pill but wants Zev to use a condom as well. Zev doesn't want to wear a condom.

- A healthcare provider

Japheth & Halah

Read the scenario together. Plan a skit to present to your classmates that shows a realistic and healthy response to this situation.

Japheth and Halah have been in a monogamous relationship (only one partner at a time) for many months. They both were tested for STBBIs and have received results showing neither of them have an infection. They no longer use condoms. Halah takes a birth control pill at breakfast each day. One Friday night, when Japheth and Halah are making out and planning to have sex, Halah realizes they forgot to take their pill that morning.

Ceri has had sex with other partners but doesn't have any symptoms. Kai would like Ceri to get tested, but Ceri doesn't want to.
