

# Condom Line-Up Game

To do this activity together as a large group:

1. Divide group into two (or more) teams.
2. Each team is given a set of cards.
3. Each person on the team takes one card (or more if necessary).
4. Have each person read their card to their group.
5. As a team, the group decides which card is the first step in condom use. The person holding that card begins to form a line.
6. The group then decides which card goes next. The person holding that card takes the next place in line.
7. This process continues with each person lining up with cards in the correct order.
8. The first group to stand with their cards in the correct order wins.

## Option

This game can also be played individually or in pairs by using small versions of the cards and laying them out on a table, or taping to the wall/board.

## Suggested Answers

1. Talk to partner about consent
2. Talk to partner about STI and pregnancy protection
3. Buy/get a condom. Store condoms at room temperature, away from direct sunlight
4. Consent to have sex
5. Check expiry date
6. Check for writing on condom packaging indicating that it provides STI/HIV protection
7. Check for holes in packaging by giving condom a gentle squeeze
8. Slide condom to the side of package and open carefully
9. Make sure the condom will go on the right way (a crease can be seen between the condom and the roll)
10. Pinch the tip of the condom
11. Unroll the condom down to the base of penis
12. Check in about consent with partner
13. Right after ejaculation, hold the rim of the condom in place and withdraw penis from partner
14. Take condom off carefully to avoid spilling semen
15. Tie condom in a knot
16. Throw condom into the garbage, not down the toilet

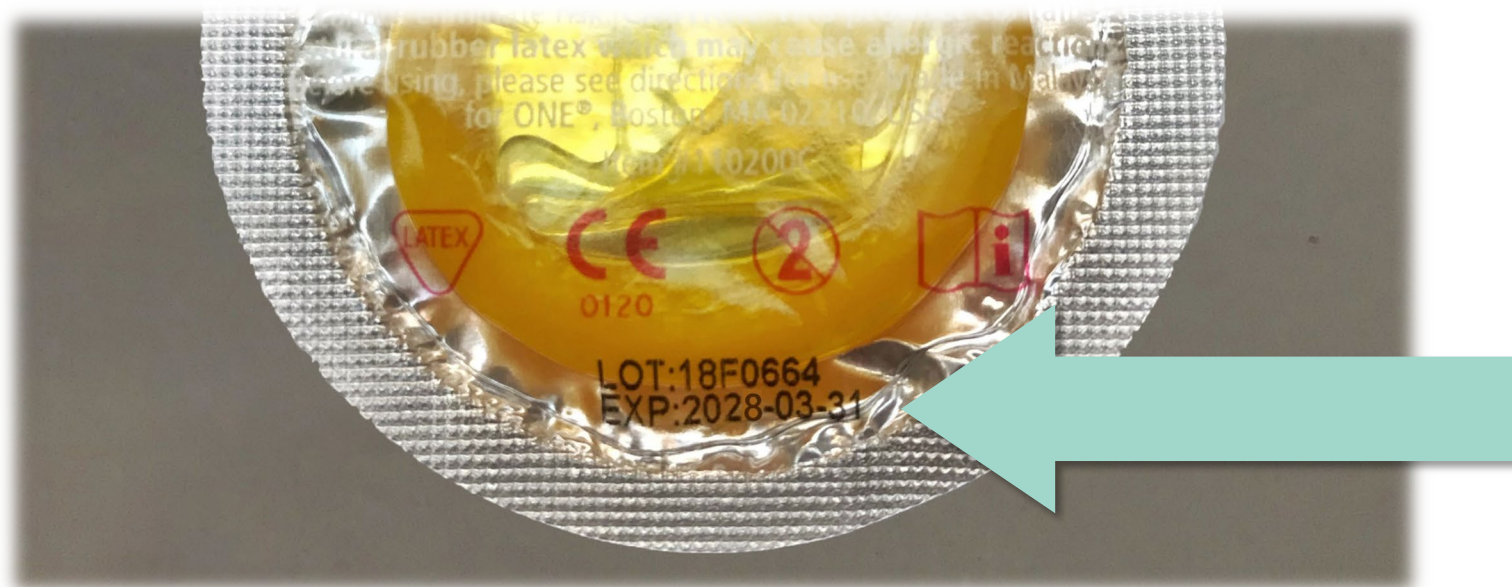



# Check for writing on condom packaging saying that it provides STI/HIV protection

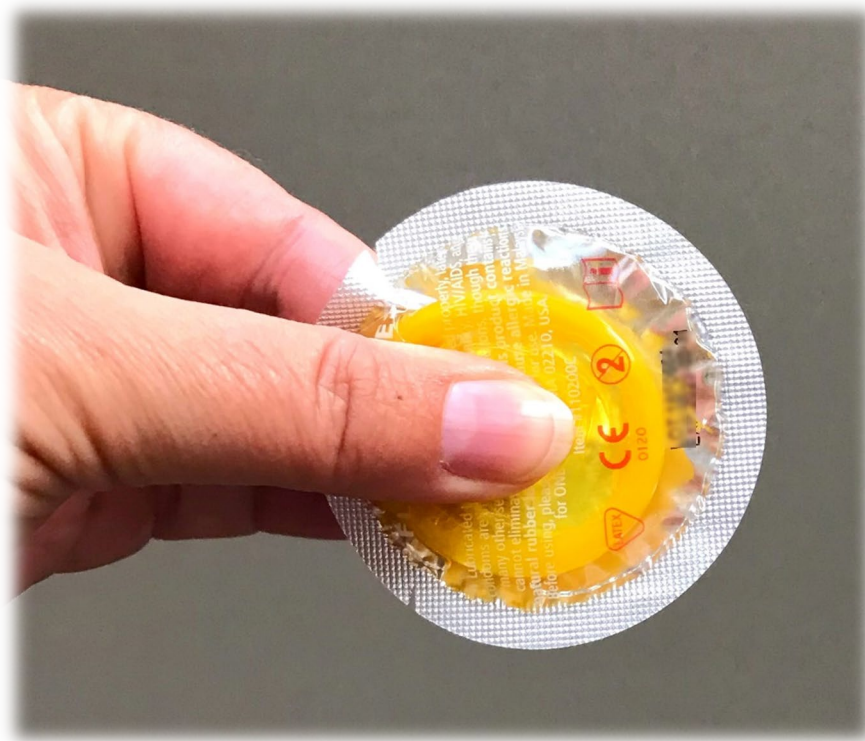


Latex condoms are intended to prevent pregnancy, HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

# Unroll the condom down to the base of penis





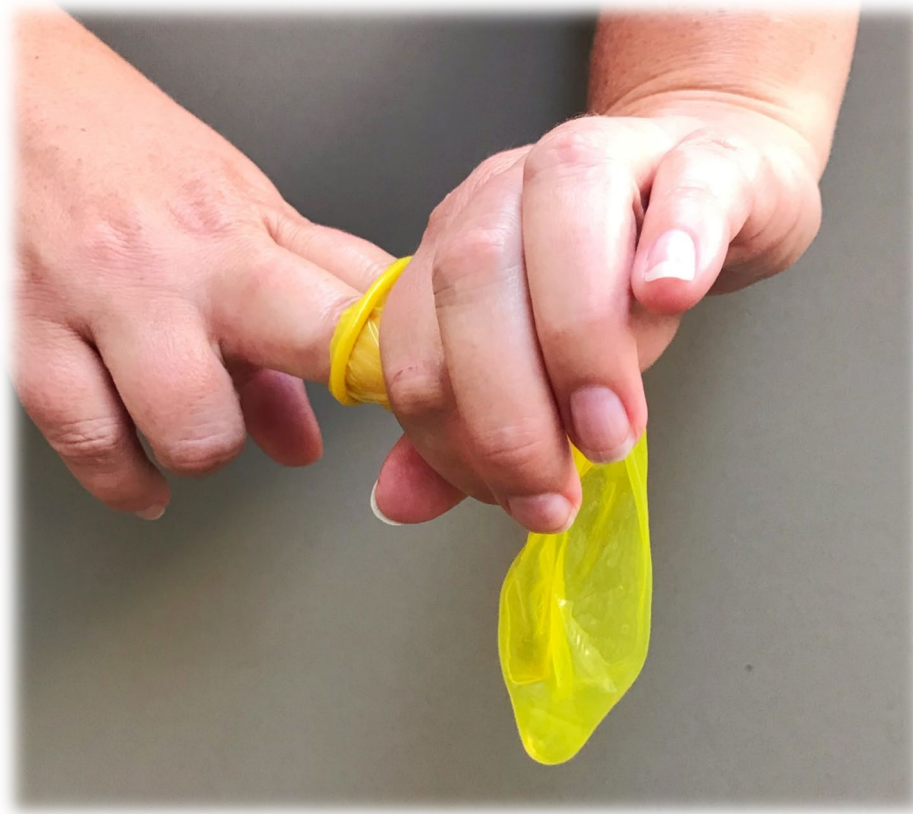
# **Check in about consent with partner**
