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Possible Answers

Basic Needs

- Food, clothing, shelter, transportation, child care, toys, medicine, school, etc.

Healthy Environment

- The parents model healthy relationships and communication for their child.
- Provide a space free of substances and second-hand smoke

- How to care for their child during each stage of life
- The child's physical, emotional, medical, developmental, and social needs
- Parenting strategies that will help meet their child's need

- Family, friends, community, church, school, government, health system, etc., can all help support families.
